FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

For six Sundays in July and August we dive into the book of Revelation. It is, first of all, an apocalypse (as "Revelation" directly translates from the Greek): a disclosure of Jesus Christ, presented in deliberately startling images and time-bending episodes, to shake off the narrow vision of ordinary life and time. Left uninterpreted, Revelation will be exploited and distorted again and again, but carefully considered, it offers us a supremely beautiful confession of faith in Christ and a visionary experience of hope for the persecuted. Revelation can inspire courage in the face of unsettled and unsettling times.



Rooted in the belief that individuals with disabilities should lead in their own lives and communities, ACT fights ableism, promotes self-advocacy, and equips people with the tools they need to understand and exercise their rights. ACT hosted the first official Disability Pride Festival in Minnesota in 2023, and will host this year's event on July 17th at the State Capitol. ACT's important work depends on community support. Financial contributions to ACT help fund training programs, leadership development, and accessible resources that enable people with disabilities to challenge barriers and advocate for systemic change.

Check – Write the name of the designated fund in the memo line.




‡ LORD'S PRAYER
