

SERMON ON THE STEPS

READING: Genesis 2:4b-3:8

R: A reading from the 2nd and 3rd chapters of Genesis.

At the time when God made the heavens and the earth, there was still no wild bush on the earth nor had any wild plant sprung up, for God had not yet sent rain to the earth, and there was no human being to till the soil. Instead, a flow of water would well up from the ground and irrigate the soil.

So God fashioned an earth creature out of the clay of the earth, and blew into their nostrils the breath of life. And the earth creature became a living being.

Then God took the earth creature and settled them in the garden of Eden so that they might cultivate and care for the land. God commanded the earth creature,

"You may eat as much as you like from any of the trees of the garden-except from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil. You must not eat from that tree, for on the day you eat from that tree, that is the day you will die--yes, die."

Then God said, "It is not good for the earth creature to be alone. I will make a fitting companion for them." So from the soil God formed all the various wild beasts and all the birds of the air, and brought them all to the earth creature to be named. Whatever the earth creature called each one, that became its name. The earth creature gave names to all the cattle, all the birds of the air, and all the wild animals.

But none of them proved to be a fitting companion, so God made the earth creature fall into a deep sleep, and while they slept, God divided them in two,

then closed up the flesh on their side. God then fashioned the two halves into male and female, and presented them to one another.

When the man realized what had happened, he exclaimed, "This time, this is the one!

Bone of my bone and flesh of my flesh!"

Now, the woman and the man were both naked, though they were not ashamed. But the snake was even more naked: the most cunning of all the animals that God had made.

The snake asked the woman, "Did God really tell you not to eat from the trees in the garden?"

The woman answered the snake, "We may eat fruit from all other trees in the garden. But of the fruit from the tree in the middle of the garden, God said, "Don't eat it and don't touch it, or you will die."

The snake said to the woman, "Die? You won't die! God knows well that on the day that you eat it, your eyes will be opened and you will be like gods, knowing good and evil!"

The woman knew that the tree was enticing to the eye, and now saw that the fruit was good to eat - that it was desirable for the knowledge it could give. So she took some of its fruit and ate it. She gave some also to the man beside her, and he ate it

Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they realized that they were naked. So they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves.

When they heard the sound of God walking in the garden in the cool of the evening, the man and the woman hid from God's presence among the trees of the garden.

September Mission of the Month: Every Meal

Over 300,000 children in Minnesota live in food insecurity, never knowing if they will have food for their next meal. Sometimes, the only complete meals kids received are those in the school cafeteria. Every meal is working to combat this issue, focusing on closing the weekend food gap from Friday to Monday, when children aren't able to receive school meals.

At the end of each week, Every Meal provides children with 4-5 pounds of substantive, nutritious food, including a fruit, vegetable, protein, grain based such as rice, paster, or oatmeal, and soup/entrée. Families may choose from five food bag options tailored to various cultural dietary preferences or situation needs.

We expect approximately 45-50 students at Barton Elementary School will register to received Every Meal food bags. A contribution of \$368 provides one student with enough food bags for the entire school year. Any donation, regardless of size, is welcome.




