## Lakeview Forum on Wednesday: **Viewing of *1946: The Mistranslation that Shifted Culture*** November 13

**6:30-7:30 pm**

This feature documentary follows the story of researchers who trace the origins of the anti-gay movement among Christians to a mistranslation of the Bible in 1946. It chronicles the discovery of never-before-seen archives at Yale University which unveil astonishing new revelations, and casts significant doubt on any biblical basis for LGBTQIA+ prejudice. Featuring commentary from prominent scholars as well as opposing pastors, including the personal stories of the film's creators, *1946* is challenging, enlightening, and inspiring. 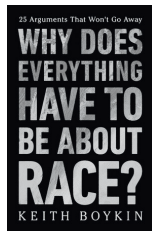
