# Next Sunday: Congregational Meeting and Vote on the Welcome Statement

All voting members should have received a letter via email and regular mail with the following information. If you have not received these communications, please notify Business Administrator Austen Hartke.

With the blessing and authority of the church council, a congregational meeting will take place following worship on Sunday, October 12. The single item on the agenda for this meeting will be the proposed congregational welcome statement, the adoption of which would designate Diamond Lake Lutheran as a Reconciling in Christ congregation. The Reconciling in Christ team has set the threshold for adopting this statement at 80%, meaning that 80% of those voting at the congregational meeting will need to vote in the affirmative in order for the motion to pass, and the welcome statement to be adopted. If adopted, this welcome statement will not replace any previous mission or vision statements, but rather will function as a stand-alone statement that communicates far more than a simple "All Are Welcome" stance. It will be featured in our congregational publications and displayed in the Commons of the church building.

Those wishing to attend the meeting without attending worship should plan to arrive no later than 10:45 am. The vote will be taken by written ballot during the meeting, which will be held in the sanctuary.

### Mission of the Month



Over 300,000 children in Minnesota live in food insecurity, never knowing if they will have food for their next meal. Sometimes, the only complete meals kids receive are those in the school cafeteria. Every Meal is working to combat this issue, focusing on closing the weekend food gap on the weekends, when children aren't able to receive school meals.

At the end of each week, Every Meal provides children with 4–5 pounds of substantive, nutritious food, including a fruit, vegetable, protein, grain base such as rice, pasta, or oatmeal, and soup/entree. Families may choose from five food bag options tailored to various cultural dietary preferences or situational needs.

We expect approximately 40–45 students at Barton Elementary School will register to receive Every Meal food bags. A contribution of \$440 provides one student with enough filled food bags for the entire school year. Any donation, regardless of size, is welcome. Gifts can be made during the offering; instructions are provided in the bulletin.

# Luther Park Clean-Up Day on Saturday, October 11

Each season, volunteers gather at Luther Park for community work days. The day begins around 9 am with coffee, pastries, and a brief meeting to organize the day's tasks. Lunch is provided, and volunteers spend the day taking on seasonal projects like closing the camp for winter or preparing it for spring. 
