thanks to the risen Jesus, the Son of God.





DISTRIBUTION

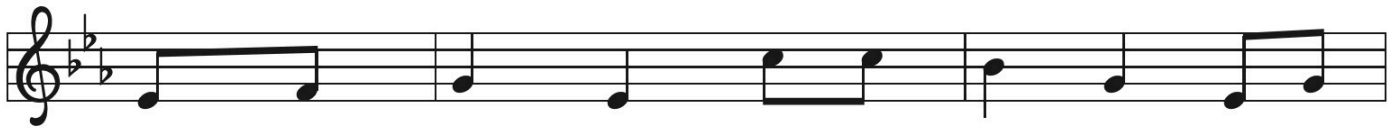

If you wish to receive a blessing, come forward with your hands over your heart.

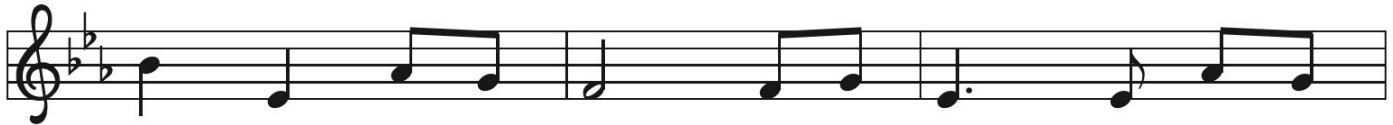

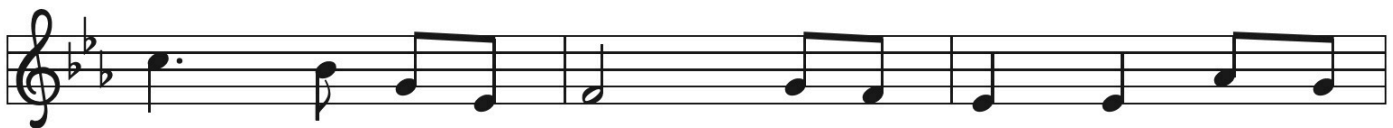
